District hires new principals for Elden, Reynolds

Baldwinsville Central School District is pleased to announce that the Board of Education has appointed new principals at Elden and Reynolds elementary schools.

Joelle Fiorini was appointed the new principal of Elden and Kathleen "Kate" Liddle was appointed the new principal of Reynolds. They start on July 1st.

Elden Principal Thomas Coughlin announced his retirement in February. Reynolds Principal Melissa Chiodo was appointed to the position of Director of Academic Services effective July 1st.

"We are excited to welcome Joelle back to Baldwinsville as the Elden Elementary School principal," said Superintendent Dr. Joseph DeBarbieri. "Her roots are in Baldwinsville. She's committed to our district and our values."

Fiorini started working for the district in 2010. She served as a teacher at Palmer Elementary School for two years and taught 6th grade at Ray Middle School for nine years. She was an administrative intern at Elden and Ray during the 2021-2022 school year. Joelle has served as the associate principal at Roxboro Road Middle School in the North Syracuse Central School District since July 2022.

"Having grown up in Baldwinsville and graduated from C.W. Baker High School, I have a deep connection to the community and its educational institutions," Fiorini said.

Fiorini resides in Baldwinsville with her husband and their three children, who are actively engaged in the district's schools.

Liddle is currently an administrator at East Syracuse Minoa Central High School. She has more than 20 years of experience in education. She has held roles in the Syracuse City School



District and the Liverpool Central School District as an instructional coach, and an English and reading instructor.

Liddle was born and raised in Central New York. After graduating from Jamesville-DeWitt High School, she attended SUNY Oswego where she earned a degree in K-12 Education. She earned her master's degree in literacy from Syracuse University and returned to SUNY Oswego for her CAS in Educational Leadership.

"My many experiences throughout my career have led me to leadership, which has become my passion," she said. "I truly enjoy working with students, teachers, and families. I am excited to share my love of learning at Reynolds Elementary within the Baldwinsville Central School District."

DeBarbieri said Liddle's passion and enthusiasm for education makes her the perfect candidate to be Reynolds' next principal.

"She brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the principal position and we're excited to welcome her to our Hive." Dr. DeBarbieri said.





A major source of revenue to operate our school program comes in aid from New York State. The chart reflects estimated revenues and revenue sources to complete the proposed financial plan.



What Happens If the Budget is Defeated?

The Board of Education has 3 options:

1. Put the same budget back before voters

- 2. Reduce the budget and ask voters to approve budget
- 3. Go directly to a contingent budget with no re-vote

If the budget is defeated twice, the board must adopt a contingent budget, which may not increase the current tax levy by any amount.

How will a contingent budget affect the school district?

Under a contingent budget, there will be no instructional or non-instructional equipment purchases and no community use of facilities unless groups or organizations pay all associated costs. Further cuts from programs and administration would be required to conform to spending caps.

Who Can Vote?

To be eligible to vote, you must be the following:

- 1.18 years of age or older,
- 2.A citizen of the United States, and
- 3. A resident of the Baldwinsville Central School District for 30 days prior to the vote

Capital Outlay Project

State law provides that a district may receive building aid in the following school year for one project each year, not to exceed \$100,000. These projects must be paid by budget appropriation (no borrowing) and require full voter authorization. This year the Board of Education has decided to include a capital outlay project for Palmer Elementary communications systems, stair tread replacement and bottle filler water cooler updates.



Tax Impact

The proposed tax levy increase of 3.89% will likely result in a lower tax rate per \$1,000 of assessed value. The overall assessed property values, taking equalization rates into account, continues to increase. The increased assessed property values provides a larger base to divide the levy over which results in the tax rate per \$1,000 being lower. This has occurred over the past 4 years, though your tax bill may increase due to an increase in the assessed value of your home.

Propositions

PROPOSITION I -- 2024-2025 Budget

Shall the proposed budget of One Hundred Thirty-Five Million, Forty-Nine Thousand, Five Hundred Seventy-Four Dollars (\$135,049,574) for the Baldwinsville Central School District as recommended by the Board of Education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, be adopted and shall the Board of Education be authorized to levy the necessary taxes therefor?

PROPOSITION II -- Internal Combustion Engine Student Transport Vehicles

Shall the Board of Education of the Baldwinsville Central School District be authorized to purchase and finance fourteen (14) diesel powered student transport vehicles, including necessary furnishings, fixtures and equipment and all other costs incidental thereto, and expend a total sum not to exceed \$2,600,000, which is estimated to be the total maximum cost thereof, and said amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and, in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District, in the principal amount not to exceed \$2,600,000, shall be issued?

PROPOSITION III -- Zero Emission Student Transport Vehicle

Shall the Board of Education of the Baldwinsville Central School District be authorized to purchase and finance one (1) zero emission student transport vehicle, including necessary furnishings, fixtures and equipment and all other costs incidental thereto, and expend a total sum not to exceed \$575,000, which is estimated to be the total maximum cost thereof, and said amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and, in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District, in the principal amount not to exceed \$575,000, shall be issued?

The community will have the opportunity to vote for four board members. Two board positions are for three-year terms commencing May 22, 2024 through June 30, 2027. One board position is for a three-year term commencing July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2027. The fourth board position fills a vacancy from May 22, 2024 through June 30, 2025.
