IMPORTANT UPDATES



Bell Schedule: Students should be in the building by 7:32am at the latest. First classes will start at 7:35am. Dismissal begins at 2:20pm. Students not staying after school with a teacher or coach need to leave the building at dismissal time.



Lockers: Any student who would like to have a locker assigned to them needs to fill out <u>THIS FORM</u> to request one. In the form you can indicate where in the building you'd like your locker to be located. Locker numbers and combinations will show up in your schooltool account.



Student Drivers: Parking for students is by permit only. Please review all of the parking requirements <u>here</u>. Registration for any Juniors or Seniors is now open.



Student drop off: Please continue to enter campus via Albert Palmer Way and turn into the Elden Bus Loop. Follow all directions from staff members. Students can be dropped off near the stop sign and they will walk to the main front entrance. The Art Wing entrance is no longer open in the morning.



SmartPass: We have implemented a fully digital student pass system. Rather than paper passes, staff will be using a digital sign out system throughout the building. We will also schedule student passes for early dismissals and counseling meetings.



Our Cultures, Our Community: In an effort to recognize and honor the diversity of our community, we are working to create a flag display that will will serve as a reminder of the cultures from which our students come. Get Involved: The student activity fair will be held during the school day on September 22. This is a great opportunity for all students to learn about all of the clubs and activities we have to offer at Baker.



IMPORTANT UPDATES



Open House: You're invited to join us at our annual open house on September 28, 2023 from 6-8pm. Come and experience what it is like to be a student in our building and meet your students' teachers.



Weapons Detection Systems: We plan to implement our new Weapons Detection Systems (metal detectors) by the end of the month. We will notify students and parents via email and text message prior to them being officially operational. Prior to full implementation, we will be working with students and staff to build an understanding of the process.

Students will be asked to disclose metal objects to attending staff members and walk though the system with bags or back packs. Hand held scanners will be used as a secondary detection to ensure that all items being brought into the building are safe. If a hand scanner is unable to identify objects, trained staff may conduct basic searches of student items and/or bags to identify any item detected.

Safety and security for our students, staff, and families is our top priority and we appreciate your support as we implement these additional tools to protect our school community.

BIMAS SCREENER

Have you ever wondered why Baldwinsville uses the BIMAS-2 as a behavior screening tool for students K-12? According to the National Council for Mental Wellbeing, the average time it takes a youth to get the help they may need is 10 years. The best intervention is **early** intervention. By using a mental health screener, Baldwinsville is able to get students connected to supports they may need early on.
