BIMAS Survey Information

April 2023

Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s):

The Baldwinsville Central School District understands how important social and emotional development and well-being is to students' successes in school, and beyond post-secondary schooling. Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) lessons and activities teach students how to manage stress, to control their behaviors, to get along with others, and to make good decisions. In order to better understand instructional needs and to gauge the effectiveness of our SEL competencies, we plan to survey all students using a screening tool known as the Behavior Intervention Monitoring Assessment System 2 (BIMAS 2). This tool measures students' social-behavioral health (behaviors that relate to SEL skills) and will be completed by the student (grades 7-12).

This information helps the schools target instructional SEL toward specific areas/skills to be developed and, over time, to measure and improve the effectiveness of these programs. As a district, we began implementing this screening tool at the elementary level a few years ago. This is our third year of implementation with this tool at the secondary level. We have been able to use this data to guide building and individual student interventions, monitor progress of programming and student behavior in order to expand preventative programs that support the overall well-being of our students.

We do want you to be aware that the screening tool/survey includes an item which assesses the students' thoughts of self-harm. In the event that your child rates this item, we will be in immediate contact with you, conduct further in-depth assessment, and assist you and your child with school support staff, potential referrals, and/or emergency services, accordingly.

Students who attend C.W. Baker High School will be taking the self report version of this screening tool:

10th Grade - Monday, April 17, 2023 11th Grade + 12th Grade - Monday, April 24, 2023





ADIRONDACK FIELD STUDIES PROGRAM

What is it?

• A six-day environmental education program that provides opportunities for students to explore and learn about the ecology of the Adirondack Mountains and gain hands-on experience using the scientific method through both a structured program and independent research. There are only two (2) spots available for Baldwinsville students.

Where and when does it take place?
The Adirondack Field Studies program takes place at the SUNY ESF Biological Field Station, Cranberry Lake in the Adirondack Mountains and will run from August 5-11, 2023.

Who attends and how do students get there?

- High school students from twelve school districts throughout Central and Western New York participate in this program.
- Transportation is provided. Charter buses take students from the OCM BOCES Liverpool campus to the Cranberry Lake Biological Station and back.

How much does it cost?

- No program cost to students. Participation fees for Baldwinsville students are paid for by the School
- District and cover instruction, food, lodging, and transportation.
 Students are responsible for the cost of food (if desired) at stops while in transit to and from the Biological Station and for souvenirs (if desired) while there. Bagged lunches are provided on both travel days and additional food purchases are not required.

What can I expect once I am there?

- Students are required to attend the entire session including the bus ride to and from the Biological Station. This is an academic program and participation is required at all times.
- Students are housed in communal cabins equipped with a bunk and mattress for each student, a desk, dressers, chairs, and clothes closets.
- Students spend a great deal of time working/studying outdoors- rain or shine. There are also four classroom buildings for lectures and lab work.
- Students work cooperatively in a small group to conduct an experiment testing a hypothesis and give a group presentation of their work.
