The past couple of weeks we have witnessed more exciting experiences for our students, including our annual cross country invitational, a couple of home football games, countless athletic events, our marching band home show, the student Activity Fair, and Junior Class Movie Night. Parents and guardians came last week to our Open House/Curriculum Night and met teachers, counselors, and support staff. We also displayed our new walk-through Garrett Threat Detection Systems, which we plan to start using on Monday, October 2nd. We spent a couple of days practicing removing items that could set off alarms from bags and backpacks and explaining the entry procedures to students. We will run a modified schedule this week to account for any extra time it will take us with the Threat Detection units up and running and will ensure that students are not missing instruction because of any delays. We have also asked students to dress appropriately for the weather as there may be lines outside of entrances as we work to get students safely and efficiently into the building to start their day. Please continue to reach out with any questions or concerns. We will make any adjustments to our procedures in the coming days and weeks to ensure our students and staff are safe and that the procedures are manageable for everyone. We greatly appreciate your support.

Students will decide whether the class will wear one similar red gown with a white striped sleeve, or continue with solid red or solid white caps and gowns, giving all students the option of choosing their preferred color.

Dear Students, Parents and Guardians,

Taking Advanced Placement courses have many benefits including rigorous coursework, college preparation, weighted grades on transcripts and getting a head start on completing college courses. C.W. Baker High School strongly encourages all students enrolled in an AP course to take the corresponding AP exam. Taking the AP Exam is an important part of the AP course experience. Scoring well on an AP exam can often earn students college credit for their high school class, saving a significant amount on tuition.

Exam registration begins Wednesday, September 27th, 2023 and ends on Friday, November 10th, 2023 at 11:59 pm. Students will order and pay for the exam using two different websites (College Board and Total Registration). Step by step directions are on the next page.

This year the cost for an AP exam is \$98.00 each. Ordering an exam(s) is not complete until students join their teacher's class on myap.collegeboard.org **AND** pay for the exam on the Total Registration website. **We strongly recommend that parents and students complete this process together.** Students requiring financial assistance can request financial assistance on the Total Registration website. **Exams that are not paid for by November 10th, 2023 will be canceled.**

Important dates for the registration process:

- Wednesday, September 27th Registration and payment period begins
- Friday, November 10th at 11:59 pm Ordering and payment period ends
- Monday, November 13 Our AP Exam order is submitted to the College Board
- Thursday, November 16th Late registration with an additional fee opens. A \$40 late fee is added to each exam. The exam fee for a test becomes \$138 each.
- Thursday, November 16th, 2023 through March 14, 2024 A test cancellation fee of \$40 is applied to any canceled tests and deducted when the exam fee is refunded. If an exam is canceled the reimbursement for the exam will be for \$56.

STEP 1: Get Student Identification Number

To complete the process, you will need your Student Identification Number. You can get this number on SchoolTool. It's a 9 digit number that starts with a 6.

STEP 2: Ordering an Exam



- Access the College Board website at https://myap.collegeboard.org/login
- On the College Board website login to a previous account or create a new account.
 - If you have taken the PSAT, SAT or previous AP test you already have an account. If you
 forgot your username or password follow the steps to reset it.
- Answer questions about your name, address, and any other questions you are prompted to answer.
- Click on the yellow button to sign up for the AP exam.
- Enter the join code (see the mailing that was sent home or your teacher for this information) for the exams you are taking.



**If you need a password or username assistance for the College Board website you MUST contact the College Board at 888-225-5427. Staff at Baker do not have access to your College Board account and are unable to access or reset the username or password.

STEP 3: Paying for an Exam

- Access the Total Registration website at www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/330300.
- Read over the directions.
- Either login to your account or create a new account. If you are creating an account, use the same email address you will use for your College Board account.
- 4. Follow the prompts on each page.
- When you get to the AP Course Information page, select the correct course, teacher and section for each of your AP courses.
- Complete the payment information using a credit card or debit card. You can also print out the payment page and mail it to Total Registration.
 - If you mail in a payment, the envelope must be postmarked by November 10th, 2023.
