NYS Smart Schools Bond Act

Passed by NYS Voters in November 2014

- Awarded \$2 Billion to all schools based on enrollment and state aid formula
 - o Baldwinsville CSD award was: \$3,697,360
 - o Smart Schools Investment Plan 1 for Network Infrastructure: \$1,242,941
 - We have \$220,661 remaining
 - o Smart Schools Investment Plan 2 for Safety & Security: \$1,493,600
 - Claim of \$349,239 pending reimbursement
 - We have \$152,699 remaining
 - o We have \$960,819 remaining for Smart Schools Investment Plan 3

Rules for the use of these funds:

Approved for 6 specific categories:

- Classroom Connectivity
- Classroom Technology
- Community Connection
- Pre-K Classroom Improvements
- Elimination of Temporary & Trailer Classrooms
- School Security and Safety

Funding *cannot* be used to:

- Pay for salaries
- Pay for software
- Pay for professional development
- Districts are expected to provide these, but they cannot be funded through the Smart Schools Bond Act.
