The team then defeated Albany – CBA by a score of 1 – 0 in the Regional title game before losing in the State semi-finals. Overall the team amassed a record of 19 – 2 – 0. The team was led on offense by Sr. Josh Price who led all AA players in goals scored while earning League Player of the Year honors. The Bees were led on defense by All-America Keeper Nate Hanna. Price, Hanna, Sr. Alex Charest(D), and Sr. Jason Hahn(F) were voted 1st Team All-League and All – CNY. Sr. Ben Rabe (M) and Jr. Jarod Katak were also named 1st Team All League. Sr. Midfielder Jake Way was named the Team's MVP for both his fine play and exceptional leadership skills.
