Early in the 2019 season, the Bees fought their way through tough matches against Living Word, FM, CNS, and Oswego, finishing the first round of league play with a record of 3 wins and 5 losses. Their first match of the season - a thrilling 5 set loss to Living Word - marked the first starting varsity match for all but one of the starting players. Bville rebounded with wins over Syracuse and Oswego - another 5 set win on their home floor. The Bees also defended their home court against FM - a tough test every season.

The 2019 squad competed in tournaments at Victor and Burnt Hills. The JV program traveled to Fairport for a tournament after Midlakes was unable to host a JV tournament for the first time in years. Attending tournaments should continue to be a scheduling priority in order to expose the teams to top competition in the area.

The second round of league play brought even tougher matches, with the Bees battling hard against JD, Liverpool, and Central Square. All told, the Bees played in 7 five set matches this season: 3 against Liverpool, 1 against Living Word, 1 against FM, 1 against Central Square, and 1 against Oswego. Nearly all of these came down to the wire, with some even going to extra points, showing that the Bees were competitive to the very end. The Bees became eligible for sectionals by virtue of their match with FM winning 3-2. Ultimately, the 2018 season ended in the Section III Semifinal with a 2-3 loss to Liverpool. Liverpool then fell to CNS in 3 sets at the Sectional Final match. This season definitely showed how the league was growing more competitive. Tight matches against Liverpool and Central Square were added to the typically challenging matches against FM, Oswego, JD, and CNS. This year also saw the addition of ESM to the JV league, which won the JV tournament and will add a varsity program next year.

Led by seniors Aidan Priest, Bradford Doubleday, Jack Stone, Dylan Bramble, Curtiss Hey, Kristof Pawelek, Carter Galle, and Anthony McGraw, the Bees finished the 2019 campaign with a 5-11 overall record. Again, while the record seems much lower than the team expected, they battled through a number of sets and could have easily finished the season with 4 or 5 additional wins. Many coaches remarked that the 5 set losses were highly competitive, excellent volleyball. Next year, with hard work, the Bees will be able to change some of those outcomes.
