Nadzan qualified for the state tournament in singles. Gould and Nesbitt won the Sectional doubles title and qualified for the state tournament.

The 2022 season began with a successful booster club camp in August that was attended by approximately 25 players from grades 7-12. We hosted campers from grades 7 and 8 attending from 8 - 10 and those in grades 9-12 attending from 9-12. The thought was that the younger players would benefit from court time on their own as well as the modeling that would occur with the older campers. Likewise, the older campers would be able to share knowledge but then have 2 hours of camp where they could play at a higher level without worrying about the safety of the younger campers. Over half of the athletes who attended camp were returning players from the 2021 Fall Junior Varsity and Varsity teams. Tryouts for both junior varsity and varsity were held at the end of August - due to numbers, no cuts were required. However, after having volleyball in Winter 2 the previous year, we saw a significant decline in the number of returning players. After graduating a large class and losing players to other sports, we fielded very small teams this year. Varsity had 15 players this year - 3 seniors, 10 juniors, and 2 sophomores. JV had 7 players (which was a huge challenge): 1 junior, 5 freshmen and 1 8th grader. Looking ahead, this is definitely an area of concern. The junior was playing in his first season ever. With such a small squad, it was very difficult for the JV team to find success - but more on that that later.

After a difficult season for all teams in the Winter 2 session, the 2022 fall squad set their season goals at the first practice following tryouts:

Early in the 2022 season, the Bees found themselves struggling to keep up with the competition. This was a bit surprising to us as we had a number of returning starters on varsity. We were returning 2 starting outside hitters and a starting setter, as well as 2 senior starters in the middle. After taking the first set of the season from Liverpool, we lost in 4 sets. This was a definite improvement to the start of our previous season, however. Our next match was vs CNS, which we lost in 3 sets. Our next match against a very talented Living Word squad, which we lost in 3 sets, scoring 20, 19, and 20 points. JD proved to be a difficult match as we lost 20, 11, and 16. The fact that JD would go on to win States for their division, bringing the crown to Section III for the first time ever, was not necessarily evident at that point in the season. Challenges continued for the Varsity squad as we lost at ESM - taking the third set 25-23 but dropping the other 3 with scores of 14, 20 and 20, followed by a much closer match vs Oswego, losing the first set at 23 points, winning the second 26-24, but losing 3 and 4 with scores of 17 and 18. We continued playing hard, searching for our first win of the season. Unfortunately, we were unable to do so against FM (losing 3 sets at 23, 17, and 12), ESM (20, 20, 19) and Syracuse (22, 25-20, 22, and 21). At the halfway point of the season, we were still winless though we were pushing teams in many of our sets. The second half of the season started with 3 set losses to Liverpool and CNS. Then, we traveled to Central Square where we secured our first win: 25-21, 25-13, and 25-20. This led to a significant turn around in our play. The next match we had against JD, we took them to 5 sets, losing 22-25, 25-22, 25-20, 12-25, and 10-15, with real chances to win the first set against this team. Rather than playing down, the Bees continued to fight. Our next match was against Oswego and that also went to 5 sets. The Bees lost 19-25, 19-25, 25-20, 25-17, 14-16. This was a bit of a heartbreaker for the team as the Bees had control of the 5th set, with a 13-11 lead before dropping the set 14-16. The Bees kept pushing, taking FM to 4 sets and playing 3 tight sets with Living Word before finishing the season at Syracuse. Syracuse had just recently defeated JD and was playing hot. The Bees were playing for pride. In an epic match, Bville lost the match in 5 sets.

For the first time in a few seasons, Bville travelled out of section and played in a tournament at Penfield. Bville lost sets in pool play but had leads or close sets against Shenendehowa, Victor, Canisius, and Living Word. After winning the semi finals of the bronze bracket, the Bees dropped the final set in a close match.

Led by seniors Caleb Way, Aidan DeLaney, and Zach Treichler, the bees kept fighting to the end of the season - finishing with a disappointing 1-16 record in a much improved league. However, with 2 sophomores gaining valuable experience, along with the junior class which continued to make improvements, things look bright for next season. While other teams lose key senior players, Bville will be ready to make a new run of its own. One of the biggest takeaways from the season was the competitive level of Section III. Many of the teams at the

Penfield Tournament were from Section III - that day, 8 of the 12 playoff spots in the Gold Bracket were Section III teams. This is a huge shift. Teams were trading wins and losses all season. FM beats CNS in the Sectional Finals. JD beats FM during the season. Syracuse beats JD. Teams are battling across the board. While this is great news for our league, it means that teams have to be prepared to battle harder, more often.

A year ago the Bees finished with an 18-3-1 record, sharing the league title. They lost a 2-1 thriller in the sectional final to the eventual state runner-up. After losing a large number of players to graduation and defections to junior hockey it looked like this season might turn into a rebuilding year. The players didn't see it that way however and responded with a 19-2-1 overall record including 10-0-1 in the league to win the '22-'23 title outright. After edging B'ville in a game that could have gone either way, the Wildcats ran the table by winning the regionals 3-0, the state semifinal 4-0 and the state championship game 6-0. Baldwinsville can make a legitimate claim that they are the second best large school hockey team in New York State but, unfortunately, were also the second best team in Section III and therefore weren't able to advance to the state level to compete for a title.

With the loss of 14 seniors due to graduation in 2023, next year looks to be a major rebuild for B'ville Hockey. The loss of talent is huge but, even more importantly, the loss of leadership provided by this exceptional group will be greatly missed. Harrison Bragg, Nick Cary, Kaleb Deluca, Drew Flynn, Jake Gipe, Jamie Gipe, Liam Hughes, Carter Little, Keegan Lynch, Brayden Penafeather-Stevenson, Garrett Sutton, Zach Treichler, Leo Vona and Brian Yager have much to be proud of.
